#### **Local Option Sales Tax**

It is an election year here in South Carolina, and while we all may have our opinions on candidates and issues, there is one topic you may not have heard about: 1% local option sales and use tax in Aiken County, often called a "penny tax."

If approved by Aiken County voters in November, this could bring Jackson around \$1.2 million that could be used for infrastructure, park improvements, and vital equipment for our first responders. This would **not** be an additional tax, but rather a reallocation of current sales tax collected.

In past years, this money has been used to purchase fire trucks, police vehicles, park equipment, fund building improvements, and serve as match money to obtain grants for water and for parks, that the town would otherwise not have funds to pursue.

A "yes" vote to the Local Option Sales Tax on November 5<sup>th</sup>, would be instrumental in Jackson's future for water infrastructure, park improvements for our families, and the continued purchase of equipment for our firefighters and police officers.

# **Police Corner**

Holiday greetings from the Jackson Police Department. There are several things to take note of this quarter:

- Please remember to restrain your dog(s) on your property. We are receiving weekly complaints of dogs at large. Having your dog at large may result in a fine up to \$1,087.50.
- The Department has hired a Code Enforcement Officer / Animal Control Officer. The Officer is currently completing training and will be a welcome addition in their specialized area.
- The holidays are a time for celebration and fellowship, but please remember not to operate any type of motorized transportation after consuming alcohol. Doing so, could result in injury, death, or arrest.

Did you know we offer a free email billing option? We also offer online and automated telephone bill payment options. We are having several customers each month reporting they didn't receive a bill in the mail, or the bill is delayed. All bills are mailed or sent by email by the first of each month prior to the next due date. If you do not receive a bill, please contact our office for your account balance.
